The G30 Social Sciences Program is jointly offered by the School of Law and School of Economics. The program includes fundamental disciplines in political science, law, economics, and business administration. Students are expected to acquire analytical and critical thinking skills and a high ethical awareness, all of which are needed for the pursuit of knowledge across disciplines. The Economics program covers various aspects, where you will learn foundational knowledge in macro- and microeconomics, before focusing on more advanced topics during your third year. Upon selection of your major, you will begin receiving specific guidance from professors in your chosen discipline and are expected to take on your own research projects for your individual graduation thesis. One of the appealing points about the G30 Economics program is the high volume of seminars and discussion classes. Starting from the first year, every student has a chance to join in seminars. That will help students to build up their academic interests, research skills as well as communication skills.

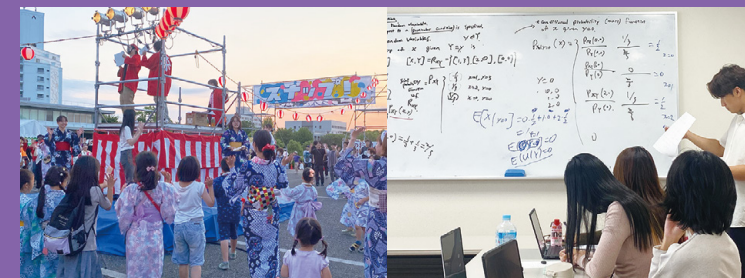
### Future goals or plans?
